

English

Using our Uganda 'hook' day as our inspiration the children will write a letter to thank Chris our Ugandan expert. They will look at the features of a letter, and include taught skills such as time words, conjunctions and expanded noun phrases. Also with an emphasis on spelling common exception words correctly using strategies to help check our work.

We will continue to focus on developing our handwriting and focus on joining.

RE

In RE we will be using the theme of stories to learn about important stories for Christians and other religions from around the world and give our response to these stories.

Design and technology

Using our knowledge of toys used in Uganda the children will design and construct their own toys using a variety of tools to perform practical tasks such as cutting, shaping and joining.

Maths

This term we will be consolidating our knowledge on place value to help us solve problems. We will be revisiting all four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and using them to solve a range of number sentences and worded problems.

We will focus on recalling number bonds, counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s with accuracy.

Geography

We will locate Uganda on a map and globe in relation to where we live, also looking at weather in Uganda and how this compares to the weather in the UK. In our learning we will find out about school life in Uganda and communicate with our Ugandan link School called Kagando. We will look at Ugandan artefacts to learn about what life is like in Uganda. The children will consider how Ugandan toys are made, what games children play in Uganda.

Science

We will begin to plant our own seeds and bulbs. We will observe them and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. We will find out what plants need to stay healthy and carry out an investigation to test this.

PE

We will continue to follow the Real PE and Real gym programmes – looking at core skills to help us.

Music

In music, we will be working with a specialist music teacher to learn about the patterns and structure of music through vocal exercises.
